NEAB Under 10's

York Masters Rugby League is for Men of 35yrs and over, with no upper age limit. Masters Rugby is just like any Rugby League but with adapted rules. The rules are based on your age, which in turn determines the colour your shorts.

White shorts = age 35-39 Full contact

Black shorts = age 40-49 Full contact

Red shorts = age 50-59 Stop momentum and or wrap up.

Gold shorts with Tags = age 60-69 Remove tag, tackle complete, no contact.

Gold shorts without tags = Any age if carrying an injury, touch completes tackle.

Green Shorts with Tags = Age 70-79 Same rules apply as gold with tags.

Blue Shorts with Tags = 80+ Same rules as previous tagged shorts.

So no, there are no limits to the age you can play up to , but the earliest you can play is 35. The oldest Masters player in the UK is well into his 80s and still playing.

Masters Rugby League has been running for over 10 years in the UK, and as well over 70 teams across the UK, there are teams in Wales, Ireland, France and Canada, with teams setting up in America and the Netherlands. These in turn create international events , with Festival held either in the UK or overseas on a regular basis.

All this rugby and non of it is competitive, The whole point of Masters Rugby League is to carry on playing, meet old and new friends and team-mates, and all walk off the pitch and into the bar for a few beers. All games played end in a 0-0 draw, no matter how many tries are scored.



York Masters is in a fantastic position to offer great facilities including Pitches, changing rooms and a Clubhouse which is open not only to York Masters, but a range of other sporting groups situated there , and open to the public for socialising and for hosting events etc.

We train and play from New Earswick Sports and Social Club. Training on a Thursday evening 7pm.

If you're interested in finding out what it's all about, or wanting to give it a go come down and have a look , speak to the players and members, have a drink or jump in and have a run around.

BLAST FROM THE PAST...

The All Blacks have been going for 45 years. Here's what happened on 11th March 2014

New Earswick All Blacks ARLFC moved up to fourth in the Pennine League Championship with a 46-18 home win over King Cross Park.

The hosts took the lead after only 27 seconds when half-back Liam Gargan crossed and converted

On ten minutes, Gargan scored his second try before winger Pete Ritchie got an unconverted try.

Debutant winger Tommy Heilds squeezed his way over the line with Gargan converting.

Gargan showed shome great passing puting stand-off Adam Kirby through the gap to score, with Gargan again successful with boot.

Centre Reece Blake powered over after a quick play the ball to give the All Blacks a 34-0 half-time lead.

Substitute prop and coach Jack Stearman powered over and Gargan goaled before King Cross hit back with three converted tries.

New Earswick had the final say when full-back Sean Malarkey went over, Gargan converting.
